On 20 Jun 1942 the Liaison Sections added a ¼-ton trailer and two ¼-ton trucks. At the same time the Maintenance Section lost one 2¼-ton truck.

On 9 October 1942 there was another reorganization. The Operations and Fire Direction Section added two fire direction computer operators and the radio section lost two wiremen & telephone operators. In addition, on 29 October 1942, an air observation section was added that contained:

- 1 Section Leader (1st Lt)(1 pistol & 1 airplane)
- 1 Pilot/Mechanic (Staff Sergeant)(1 pistol & 1 airplane)
- 3 Privates
  - 1 Aircraft Mechanic (1 carbine)
  - 1 Ground crew Helper (1 carbine)
  - 1 Truck Driver (1 carbine, 1 3/4-ton weapons carrier & 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ -ton trailer)

A fourth change occurred on 7 August 1944 when the air observation section combined the functions of the ground crew helper and the truck driver. In addition, the anti-aircraft/anti-tank section dropped the four basic privates, reducing its total strength of privates to 35 from the original 39.
