\* The TO&E is a bit confusing on the issue of who handles packmules. The command post & Survey section is shown as havintg four pack mules, but only the headquarters clerk is indicated as handling them. However, in the battery headquarters the two orderlies are shown as handling pack mules, but there are no pack mules assigned to the battery HQ. I suspect the mules were assigned to the CP&S Section, but they were led by other units personnel.

\*\* Shown as driving a pack animal, but this does not seem like an officer's job. Probably an error.
