The battery headquarters reduced the nine basic privates to five and the battery detail added a three 3/4-ton weapons carrier with two ¼-ton trucks. In addition, those battalions that were part of infantry divisions added a Forward Observer Section was that consisted of a 1st Lt (pistol), a reconnaissance Sergeant (Sergeant) (1 carbine) and a private (1 carbine & drove ¼-ton truck)

Note: In the 1942 TO&Es the machine gun crews were broken out clearly with machine gunners and assistant machine gunners. Apparently in a movement towards efficiency, it was decided that if the machine gun was to be employed, one of the individuals who had another job would step in and serve as the loader. The "machine gun corporal" was in overall command of the two machine guns assigned to his group.
