In the beginning of 1760 the twelve "stammregimenter" or principal regiments, each gave only one grenadier company and they were organized as followed:

Dieringshofen (21/27) & Kleist (37/40) \Rightarrow Kleist (680 men) Willemey (4/16) & Benckendorff (41/44) \Rightarrow Benckendorff (680) Vornstedt (13/26) & Heyden (19/25) \Rightarrow Schwerin (838)

Freibataillons 21 off, 35 NCO, 5 mus, 750 men (811 total) Foreign Regiments had a double strength.

Corps des Volontaires de Prusse (Trumbach Freibataillon) had 1 grenadier company and three musketeer companies. Each had 5 officers (Leib co - 7), 10 NCO's 4 musicians, 3 sappers and 141 men. Its jagers consisted of 1 officer, 3 NCO's, 40 men. The artillery had 1 officer, 2 NCO's, 16 men.

In 1757 the Fussja"gers had two companies, with a total of 6 officers, 10 NCO's (Oberja"ger) and 300 men = 316 total.

The 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 7th, 8th, 1lth, and 12th Regiments had only 1 tympanist and 4 musicians, also with the 15 drummers giving a a total of 20 musicians ("speilleute".) The 10th Regiment had an additional tympanists in place of the musicians and only 15 musicians ("speilleute".)
