1st Naval Infantry Division: Formed February 1945 in Stettin from the Marine Schützen Brigade Nord.

The 3rd Marine Schützen Regiment was sent to the Vistula in Jan/Feb 1944. The other regiments were used to form the division. It was later reorganized and redesignated as the 1st Naval Infantry Division and had:

 $\frac{3\text{rd}}{100}$  Naval Infantry Division: Formed 1 April 1945 in Pommerania from the 163rd Infantry Division. It had been formed on  $\frac{11}{10}$  as a 7th Wave Division and had served in Finland until 1944. In March 1945 it was joined to the 3rd Panzer Army in Pommerania. On  $\frac{4}{14}$  it passed to the Navy. It was organized with:

It was disbanded in September 1944, during the withdrawal from France.
