

French Fortress Units 1940

During peacetime France had 32 fortress battalions and eight Rhine Machine Gun Battalions. This supported the theoretical organization of eight brigades, each with four battalions and a machine gun battalion. Each of the 24 fortified sectors (secteurs fortifiés) were the equivalent of a division and together they manned the Maginot Line.

After 16 March 1940 five sectors were converted into Fortress Infantry Divisions (*Division d'Infanterie de Forteresse - DIF*): the 101e through the 105e DIF. They were then organized into the Army Fortress Corps (*Corps d'armée de Forteresse - CAF*).

A fortified sector generally contained 2-3 fortress regiments, an engineer battalion and the equivalent of two regiments of "position" artillery.
