Division had a total of 10,500 men, 168 LMG's, 90 HMG's, 56-45mm mortars, 12 81mm mortars, 24 47mm AT guns, 531 cars, 1,170 trucks and 48 tractors.

There were only two such divisions when the war erupted, Trieste and Trento. There were also three so called auto-transportable divisions. In these latter divisions, only the artillery was supposed to be motorized, but it wasn't always motorized.
