29th (mot) Infantry Division:

- 1 strong strength engineer battalion (100% mobile)
- 5 Panzer II
- 23 Panzer III (long)
- 10 Panzer III (75mm gun)
- 1 Panzer III (short)
- 14 Panzer IV (long)
- 2 Command tanks

297th Infantry Division:

- 4 medium strength, 1 weak and 2 cut up infantry battalions (100% mobile)
- 1 weak engineer battalion (100% mobile)

371st Infantry Division:

- 7 cut up & 1 weak infantry battalions (65% mobile)
- 6 light & 3 heavy batteries (each with 2 heavy howitzers)
- 1 werfer battery (40% mobile)

1st Rumanian Infantry Division:

- 2 medium strength, 2 cut up & 3 weak infantry battalions (100% mobile)
- 9 76.2mm btrys (100% mobile)
- 4 100mm howitzer btrys (100% mobile)

2nd Rumanian Infantry Division:

- 6 medium strength and 1 cut up infantry battalions (100% mobile)
- 9 75mm btrys (2 with 3 guns ea) (100% mobile)
- 4 100mm howitzer btrys (100% mobile)

4th Rumanian Infantry Division:

- 3 strong, 4 cut up infantry battalions (95% mobile)
- 1 strong engineer battalion (100% mobile)
- 7 75mm btrys (2 with 3 guns ea) (100% mobile)
- 4 100mm howitzer btrys (100% mobile)

20th Rumanian Infantry Division:

- 7 strong infantry battalions (75% mobile)
- 1 strong engineer battalions (75% mobile)
- 6 Light Batteries (76.2mm guns) (75% mobile)
- 6 Heavy Batteries (100mm howitzers) (75% mobile)
