Organizational Changes:

On 9 October 1943 the branches (i.e. artillery, infantry, etc.) of some of the officers became "branch immaterial". In addition, some officer collateral duties were assigned.

On 27 January 1944 the S-1 duties were given to a major and the captain who had performed those functions remained solely as the S-4 officer. In addition, the ranks of some of the radio operators changed.

On 16 June 1944 the Battery Headquarters added an Athletic instructor and an entertainment director. The number of basics was reduced to five. It also added two ¼-ton trucks and two ¼-ton trailers. The Maintenance Section added a second private Army Airplane & Engine Mechanic and a ¼-ton truck for the liaison pilots use.

Note: In the 1942 TO&Es the machine gun crews were broken out clearly with machine gunners and assistant machine gunners. Apparently in a movement towards efficiency, it was decided that if the machine gun was to be employed, one of the individuals who had another job would step in and serve as the loader. The "machine gun corporal" was in overall command of the two machine guns assigned to his group.
