Reorganized 4th Rumanian Infantry Division: (10/25/44)

 - 1 heavy company (1 60mm & 2-3 81mm mortars)
 - Mortar Detachment (2-120mm mortars)
- 20th Infantry Regiment
- 21st Infantry Regiment
- 3 Penal Battalions (4 AT guns assigned to these bns)
- 10th Artillery Regiment¹
 - 5-75mm guns, 8 100mm guns, & 8 120mm mortars
- AT Company (4 AT guns)

¹ The newly reconstituted 10th Artillery Regiment was formed from the old 2nd, 5th and 10th Artillery Regiments.

1st Rumanian Cavalry Division: (on 10/4/44)

1st Cavarly Regiment (3 sqns ea, 100 men, 2 HMGs, 10 LMGs)

2nd Cavarly Regiment (3 sqns ea, 100 men, 2 HMGs, 10 LMGs)

5th (Rosiori) Cavarly Regiment (same as other two regiments)

11th Hussar Regiment (3 sqns, the 3rd Sqn was disbanded)

36th Artillery Regiment (3 guns)

Flak Detachment (12 20mm AA guns as of 1/4/45)

Note: On 10/21/44 the 4th Cavalry Regiment, the 11th Cavalry Regiment and the 12th Cavarly Regiment were reorganized into a March Battalion.
