On 26 February 1944 the Headquarters Battery added a ¼-ton truck and the 3/4-ton command trucks became 3/4-ton weapons carriers. The 105mm battalions converted their 3/4-ton command trucks to 3/4-ton weapons carriers, raised the ¼-ton trucks from 21 to 25, and the ¼-ton trailers from 12 to 15. In the 155mm battalions the 3/4-ton command trucks converted to 3/4-ton weapons carriers, the ¼-ton trucks rose from 16 to 18, and the ¼-ton trailers rose from 9 to 10.
