On 26 February 1944 the Headquarters Battery added a $\frac{1}{4}$ -ton truck and the $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton command trucks became $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton weapons carriers. The 105mm battalions converted their $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton command trucks to $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton weapons carriers, raised the $\frac{1}{4}$ -ton trucks from 21 to 25, and the $\frac{1}{4}$ -ton trailers from 12 to 15. In the 155mm battalions the $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton command trucks converted to $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton weapons carriers, the $\frac{1}{4}$ -ton trucks rose from 16 to 18, and the $\frac{1}{4}$ -ton trailers rose from 9 to 10.
