Note: The principal reason for this change from the 15 July 1943 TO/E is the apparent promotion of men through the ranks. The rank of Technical Sergeant has appeared in the battalion, for the first time

in the 1940's and there is a shift upwards in grade in every rank below 1st Sergeant in all ranks with most of the privates becoming Privates 1st Class. Those the remained Privates were probably new recruits being feed into the battalions as replacements.

Note: On 30 June 1944 there was the last change in the battalion structure until 1 February 1950. Those changes were:

 Privates reduced to 19
 Added 6 .30 cal LMGs, 2 .45 cal submachine guns
