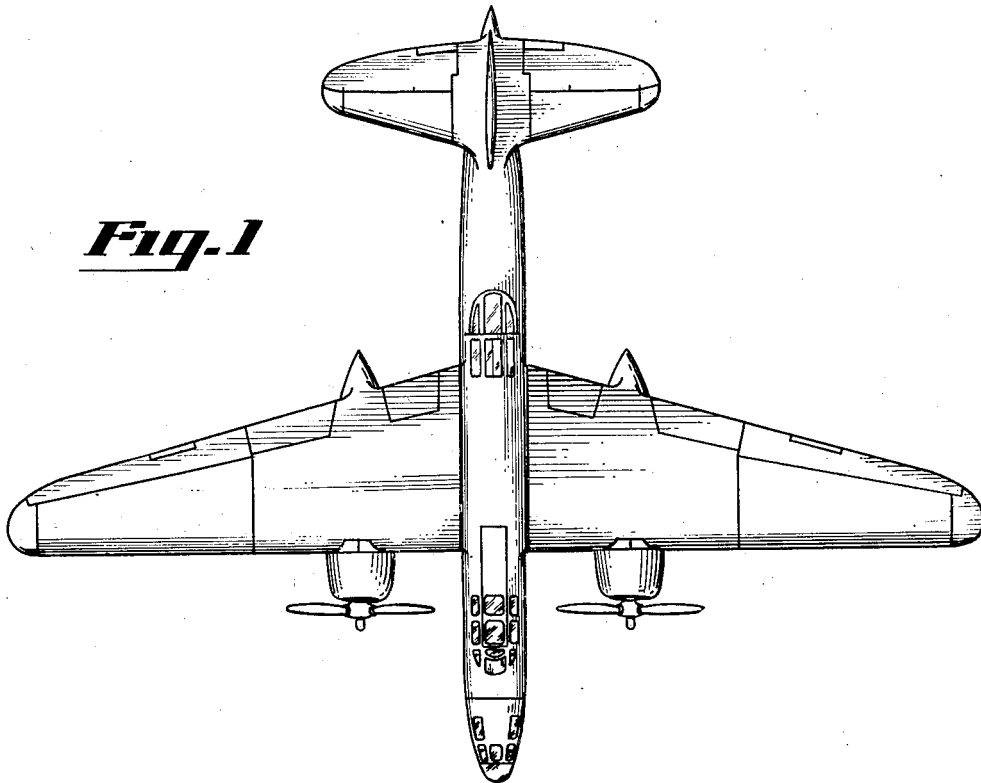

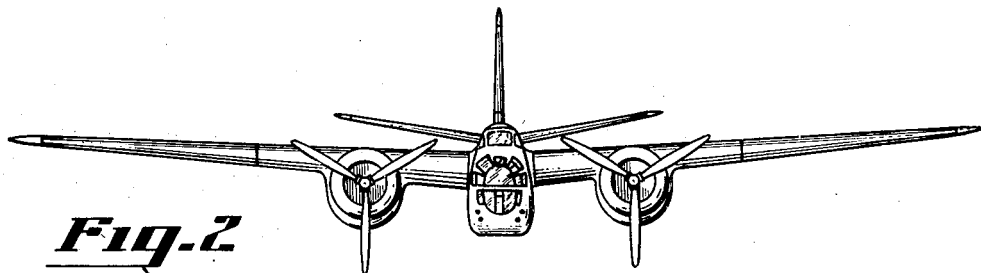
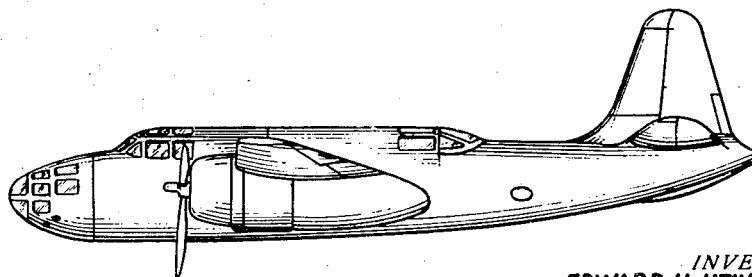

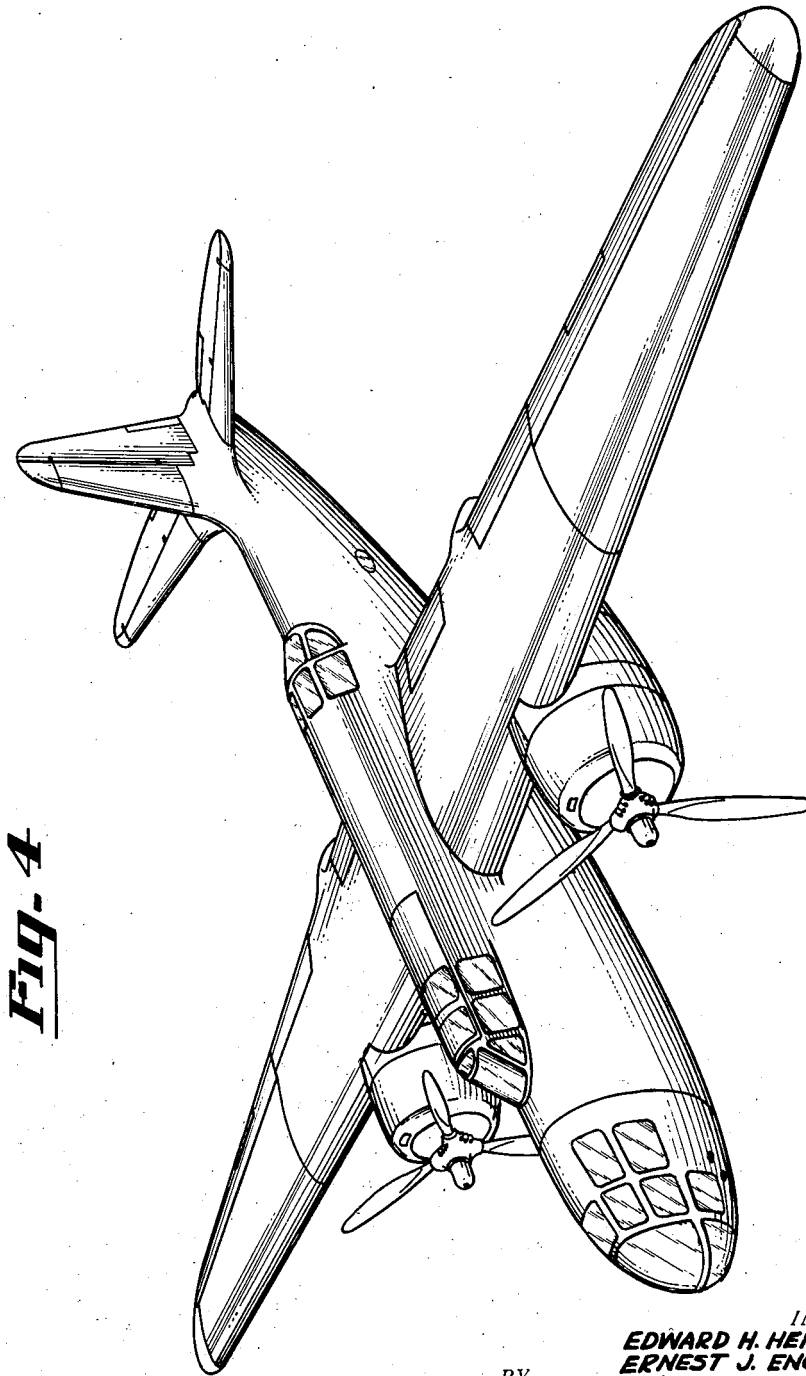

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Edward H. Heinemann and Ernest J. Englebert, citizens of the United States and residents of Los Angeles, in the county of Los Angeles and State of California, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Attack Bomber Airplane, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a plan view of the attack bomber airplane;

Figure 2 is a front elevational view of the airplane depicted by Figure 1;

Figure 3 is a side elevational view of the airplane depicted by Figure 2; and

Figure 4 is a top perspective view of the airplane in flight.

We claim:

The ornamental design for an attack bomber airplane, substantially as shown.
